Region 5 - Excellent Category

- Nearly steady on a dollar per PI year over year
- Land market strengthened in the 4th Quarter
- Great variability! Two auctions, three tracts within six miles on the same day, had a differential of \$5,000 per acre!





Region 5 Good Productivity





Region 5 - Good Category

- On a \$ per PI basis values declined just over 1%
- On a simple average values increased 1%
- Sales volume was up 36%!
- Prices held even with greater supply





Region 5 - Average Category

The committee anticipated significant softening in the market

- Nearly identical to last year!
- Caution the data set is small at 14 sales





Region 5 - Recreational

- Sales volume increased 50%
- Individual sale prices varied greatly
- Proximity to higher population centers has a very positive impact on value

Region 6 - Excellent Category

- Market steady year over year at \$10,600
- Steady cash rents support market
- Logan County Highest documented sale prices, this is different from prior years - Christian, Macon, Moultrie, Piatt Counties typically take top honors

Region 6 - Good Category

- Values are down 8.7%
- Caution-31 sales documented this year compared to only 12 sales last year last year this category showed an increase in value when all other categories were showing a decrease.
- Imperfections matter! Waterways, field shape, drainage, trees, ditches



Region 6 - Average Quality land

- Data set is limited, but consistent with prior years
- Market is flat year over year at \$6,050
- Majority of sales come from Shelby county





Region 6 - Fair Quality land

- Very limited data with only six sales
- Data shows market is up 12.5%, but the committee agrees that it is flat
- All the sales were from Shelby County and a majority came from the southeast portion - a very strong area of the county, location matters!



Region 6 - Recreational

- Transactions documented were up over 60%
- Excluding Permanent CREP Average is \$3,950 per acre.
- In general the market is flat year over year
- Individual sale prices varied greatly
- Permanent CREP leads values to the downside, these sales have very limited use for the land



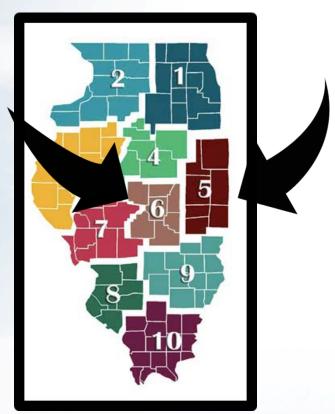
General Conclusions

- High Quality Land is still in demand.
- Good quality tracts = best value?
- Imperfections matter more than ever.
 Waterways, ditches, field shape, topography, drainage, lack of road frontage.

Demand for recreational properties is good.
