Cochran Receives ISPFMRA Hall of Fame Award

Don Cochran, ARA, (right, above) has been named to the Illinois Society of Professional Farm Managers and Rural Appraisers' "Hall of Fame" for his many years of service to the organization and to agriculture in Illinois.

Cochran and his wife, Doris, own and operate Cochran Ag Services, an agricultural appraisal company located in Wheeler, IL.

The presentation was made by Ernest Moody, AFM, ARA, CAC, with Heartland Ag Group of Springfield. He cited Cochran's lifelong involvement with Illinois agriculture.

Cochran grew up on a grain and hog farm in Jasper County and graduated from the University of Illinois in 1973. He also has an MBA from Lewis University. Upon graduating he began working as a credit officer with the Federal Land Bank of St... Louis. Over the years his career took him to the Illinois Farm Development Authority which led him to become involved with the Illinois Society group. He received his Accredited Rural Appraiser designation in 1990 and was president of the group in 2001. He also served two terms as president of the Illinois Coalition of Appraisal Professionals Board which is the political action group for the Illinois Appraisal industry.

In his comments, Moody noted "Whenever the Illinois chapter has asked Don Cochran to help, he has always stepped forward with a smile on his face. Whenever he accepts a task, we know it will be done correctly and professionally."

The Hall of Fame award has been presented only 29 times in the ISPFMRA's 80-year history.



Wolf Receives "Service to Agriculture Award"

Bob Swires, AFM, (right, above) present the Service to Agriculture Award, one of the Chapter's highest awards, to Illinois producer and industry leader Terry Wolf during the organization's annual meeting held here recently. The award has been given annually since 1940 to individuals who have distinguished themselves with service to agriculture in the state.

In make the presentation Bob Swires reviewed Wolf's contributions to the state noting his many years of leader-ship.

Swires noted that in Illinois Wolf has been chairman of the Illinois Corn Marketing Board, chaired the Council for Agriculture Research (C-FAR) and was one of the individuals instrumental in the formation of that organization.

On the national level, Wolf was involved with putting together the National Coalition for Food and Agriculture Research, not only as a founding member, but subsequently as chairman of the group. He was also chair of the U.S. Feed Grains Council, in Washington, D.C.

"Terry's hard work brought many projects and a great deal of funding to many organizations, bus specifically to the four universities here in Illinois -- Southern Illinois University, Western Illinois University, Western Illinois University, and the University of Illinois College of ACES," Swires stated.

Wolf, with his wife, Jan, and son, Jeremy, farm 2,650 acres in a four-county area around Homer, IL, which is the family home. They also operate Wolf Grain Systems.

of the game," Davis says.

"We are asking that everyone leave from and return to the Four Points. We will distribute all tickets as we load the bus," Davis stressed. "People will need to reserve a seat on the buses because we have to have an accurate count."

A Full Wednesday

A full schedule is planned for Wednesday, June 18 with an early morning continental breakfast followed by bus departure set for 8 a.m.

"We're going to start out the day by visiting the Italgrani USA River Terminal and flour mill on the west bank of the Mississippi River in St. Louis," says Mark Weber, ARA, a planning committee member.

The heart of the company's industrial operations is located in St. Louis, with a 4 million-bushel grain elevator and one of the world's largest single line durum wheat



mills (daily capacity of 15,600 cwt of prime product per day). This mill was originally built in 1987 and has been expanded several times since the initial construction, as well as being continuously updated with new milling technology.

From Flour Directly to Pasta

As the flour is processed at Italgrani, it is moved by pneumatic tubes across the street to the facilities at New World Pasta, the leading dry pasta manufacturer in the United



States. Brands which may be familiar to tour-goers include American Beauty, Creamette, Prince, Ronzoni and San Giorgio. The company also supplies pasta products manufactured under private label agreements.

Now, On To Lunch

Once everyone's appetite has been stimulated, it will be

time to board the buses and make the short trip across town to visit Monsanto World Headquarters where the group will be served lunch. Top management executives from the company will be on hand to address and answer questions regarding current and future issues the company is exploring.

If You Visit St. Louis You've Gotta Visit

The afternoon will be capped by a walking tour through the brewery operations of Anheusuer-Busch Brewing Company, parent of the self-proclaimed "King of Beers."

Attendees will learn about the rich brewing heritage of Anheuser-Busch and how fresh beer is brewed and packaged today. The tour provides an opportunity to see state-of-the art facili-



ties, including brew houses, beechwood aging cellars and packaging facilities.

World Shooting Complex at nearby Sparta, IL. Dinner will be served here by the locally-famous 17th Street Bar & Grill. Those so inclined will be able to try their hand at any number of shooting activities including sporting clays. Firearms will be available on-site for a nominal fee.

From Limestone to Locks and Dams

Thursday morning, June 19, will start off with an earlymorning breakfast buffet before loading onto buses for a quick ride to Bussen Quarries, Inc., a huge limestone quarry, underground warehouse and river terminal.

The Bussen family has been mining crushed limestone to service the St. Louis area aggregate needs since 1882! With three production sites, they are one of the largest crushed stone producers in the Midwest area. They will try to time a blast while we are visiting the site. The Bussen Underground Warehouse is a limestone mine that was engineered and mined for the specific purpose of creating a climate controlled warehouse.

The constant year-round temperature within finished space is between 65 and 72 degrees. It provides an ideal



working temperature for employees. Several tenants have added cooling capacity to bring the temperature down to zero degrees

for freezer space, or 35 degrees for cooler space. They have enjoyed utility savings of up to seventy percent!

The warehouse has state-of-the-art safety features for fire and smoke detection, carbon monoxide detection, and fresh air ventilation. Utilities are provided by Ameren UE, St. Louis county water, and the metropolitan sewer district.

Final Stop -- Melvin Price Locks and Dam

Melvin Price Locks and Dam is located on the Upper Mississippi River at river mile 200.78, two miles downstream from the original Lock and Dam No. 26, near Alton, IL. Melvin Price Locks and Dam replaced Lock and Dam No. 26.

1:30 p.m. -- Return to Four Points Sheraton Note: All time are approximate *See separate Registration This is the first replacement structure on the Upper Mississippi River nine-foot navigation project. Construction of the Locks and dam began in 1978 and was completed in 1994, but the structure became partially operational in 1990. The structure consists of a dam - 1,160 feet long with 9 tainter gates, each 110 feet wide by 42 feet high. There are two lock chambers at Melvin Price. The main



chamber is 1,200 feet long by 110 feet wide while the auxiliary chamber is 600 feet long by 110 feet wide. In 1990, the first year of operation, 80 million tons of cargo passed through the locks and dam.

Invited to join the group for lunch are Sen. Christopher Bond (R-MO) and Representative Jerry Costello (D, Illinois, 12). Both are expected to brief the tour group on the funding for the upgrading of lock and dams along the Upper Mississippi and Illinois rivers.

Local media have been invited.

The buses are scheduled to return to the Four Points by 1:30 p.m.

2008 Appraisal Education Schedule

Cost Estimating

Description: The Cost Estimating Seminar is an 8-hour seminar and will provide the student a background in the cost approach and actual experience in estimating cost using Marshall Valuation Service. The seminar will review the theory and methodology, and then concentrate on the cost estimating portion.

Topics: Topics will include estimate land value, determine appropriate cost basis, estimate direct (hard) and indirect (soft) costs if improvements at valuation date, estimate (or address) entrepreneurial profit, add direct, indirect costs and entrepreneurial profit to arrive at total improvement cost, estimate depreciation, deduct estimated depreciation to obtained depreciated cost, estimate contributory value of any site improvements, add land value to depreciated cost to arrive at indicated value, adjust the indicated value for any personal property or intangibles.

Description: This constantly evolving seminar keeps appraisers up-to-date with the latest revisions and changes to the Uniformed Standard of Professional Appraisal Practice (USPAP) as adopted by the Appraisal Standards Board (ASB).

Boyd went on to explain that a good deal of the program during the 2009 Congress will address the elements of the theme. "There will be a great many academic papers presented and the subjects of those presentations will springboard off the theme that we have selected.

An International Logo

The logo has a true international flavor to it as it was designed by a young fine artist in Dimitrovgrad, Bulgaria. "Dido Kaludov is the brother of one of our daughtersin-law," explains Carroll Merry, executive director of the Illinois Society. "We met Dido when our son and his wife were married in Bulgaria three years ago. We knew



he had a particular talent for design concepts, so when it came time to develop a logo we asked him to submit some ideas. The final piece is actually a composite of two renditions he submitted.

"He has finished his formal education and is currently working for a company that produces

music. He does a great deal of the art on the cd jackets," Merry notes. "We did not want a corn and soybeans theme in the graphics. It had to be something that could be considered much more universal in approach."
